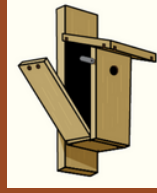


Maple Seed Helicopter

Connects kids to their watersheds and their imaginations

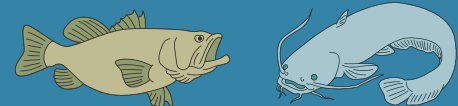

Draw a Fibonacci Spiral

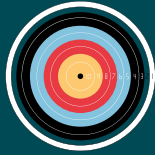
